### Employments

Anna Margherita Jasink obtained the degree in Humanities at the University of Florence in 1970. She has been Research Fellow from 1971 to 1973 and Research Assistant ("Contrattista") from 1974 to 1981, at the University of Florence. She has been Researcher at the University of Florence from 1981 to 2002, when she was nominated **Associate Professor of Aegean Civilisations**, which is the position held up to 2016. From 1976 to 2002, she has been also Professor of Ancient Near Eastern History at the University of Turin.

### Institutional Charges

In the University of Florence she has been in charge of **several academic positions** (Director of the Aegean Civilisations curriculum in the postgraduate Specialisation School in Archaeology and of the same curriculum in the PhD School in Ancient History and Archaeology, President of the Master Degree Course in Archaeology, Member of the Councils of the Faculty of Letter and of the Department of Antiquities). Actually she is a component of the new Department of History, Archaeology, Geography, Art and Spectacle (DBAS), where she is member of the Didactic Committee. In the University of Turin she was Referent Professor in the postgraduate Specialisation School.

### Research interests and activities

The research interests and activities of Anna Margherita Jasink have been and are generally concerned with the **field of Ancient Aegean and East Mediterranean civilisations**, and within this field her interests ranged in a wide variety of topics that require different but parallel approaches focused on philological and historical knowledge, with a distinct interdisciplinary approach. In fact her research field has been concerned with both philological and historical themes connected to the Ancient Aegean and Eastern Mediterranean/Near Eastern civilisations. Her direct knowledge of written documents - in particular Cuneiform (Hittite and Akkadian), Anatolian and Luwian Hieroglyphs, Cretan Hieroglyphs, Linear A and B, Cypro-Minoan - , has been associated with specific information and work in archaeology, adequate to propose historical reconstructions of various periods and areas.

Actually, during her stay as professor at the Universities of Florence and Turin she exploited the opportunity to participate to archaeological missions, in particular to expeditions in the near East (e.g. in Iraq, Ancient Mesopotamia, in the site of Hamrin, where she participated to the excavation of a palace belonging to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Millennium BC, and in Italy at Vivara, Procida, where a Mycenaean site of the half of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Millennium BC was found). These experiences have significantly contributed to her expertise. Such expertises allowed Margherita Jasink to obtain the direction of an archaeological mission in Cyprus, as will be described in the following. As a consequence, the archaeological aspects of the research has became in many cases a peculiar element and the possibility of co-operating with authorities in this field favoured an increased interdisciplinary approach to her researches.

## Specific research fields:

**Regional histories.** A particular attention has been devoted to this topic, because of its strict connection with cultural and economic exchanges among different civilisations. Cilicia has been considered as a case study of particular relevance. The results of this study and the monograph published in collaboration with P. Desideri (*Cilicia. Dall'età di Kizzuwatna alla conquista macedone*, Firenze 1990) have received much attention in the community and have been supplemented by further articles and invited participation at important international congresses. An equally significant example in the ambit of regional histories is the Cypriot civilisation and a number of contributions on this subject are the result of our present research, connected on our archaeological activity on field as well.

**Cultural and political interactions and economic exchanges.** Several topics in this field have been covered, with a particular attention to the interaction between Mycenaeans and the various Near-eastern peoples (Hittites, Syrian kingdoms, Egyptians). But the research has been extended to previous periods, i.e. on the debated question on the Indoeuropeans (noteworthy is a book on *Movimenti di popoli nell'area egeo-anatolica. III-II millennio a.C.*, Firenze 1983) and to the later case of the preclassical period in the Syro-Anatolian area (a monograph has been published on *Gli Stati Neo-Ittiti. Analisi delle fonti scritte e sintesi storica*, Pavia 1995). Cyprus has been as well included in the ambit of this research during these last years, since the contacts of the island with the surrounding areas have specific relevance in its culture.

**Written documents.** A philological analysis of the texts (Minoan, Mycenaean, Cypro-Minoan, Hittite) and their setting against the political, economic and social background of their historical period has been carried, with a critical investigation about the overall role of writing concerning the Mycenaean world. Dedicated studies on Anatolian Hieroglyphic and Cretan Hieroglyphic seals have been published and an extensive research on the Corpus of the Cretan Hieroglyphic seals has been completed (see the recent monograph *Cretan Hieroglyphic seals. A new classification of symbols and ornamental/filling motifs*).

**Aegean glyptic.** Following the first researches on Cretan Hieroglyphic seals, the scientific field of studies has extended to the Aegean glyptic more in general, with the aim of an analysis of the functions of seals and sealings in the Minoan-Mycenaean cultures. A volume on “*Minoan Cushion Seals*”, a typology of seals peculiar to Aegean glyptic, has been published in 2014.

## Research Projects

This interdisciplinary approach is a basic feature in the specific activity of Margherita Jasink but, most of all, has been important to guide young people in general and in particular her pupils, trying to activate scientific groups interested in far-reaching projects, inside which each of them may have his own space of research. In this context she has activated many collaborations among philologists, historians, archaeologists, and, for specific complex researches, with informatics, chemists, physicians, earth scientists, engineers and architects.

As an outcome of this aptitude, Prof. Jasink has paid in these last years a great attention to supervising the research activity of many students and pupils, trying to found projects in which their own expertise may be useful. To more efficiently pursue these objectives, a Laboratory of Aegean Civilisation has been created in Florence since 2005, with A.M.Jasink as director and coordinator. It has also became a web portal for many active projects on these topics, including:

**The DBAS Project.** The aim of the Data Bases about Aegean Subjects on-line Project is to create a linking data base on different Aegean matters, in order to set new connections among otherwise not easily related materials or themes. The Project represents a new tool with both scientific and educational

purposes. The Project, open to collaborations, can be accessed at web site <http://dbas.sciant.unifi.it> and is part of the activities of the Department SAGAS of the University of Florence.

**The Kouris river valley Project.** This project concerns historical-archaeological expeditions in Cyprus, consisting in the survey of the area (the first mission was undertaken in 2006) and in the following excavation of a site (*Erimi/Laonin tou Porakou*), now directed by Dr. L.Bombardieri; it is organized as a multidisciplinary project, with a specific archaeological and historical section, supplemented by topographical aspects (GIS, remote sensing, geo-prospecting). The updating and the bibliography about the Project appear on DBAS in a special section. A first meeting has been held in 2009 in Florence about our researches in the Kouris valley, enlarged to further researches on Cypriote History and Archaeology, and the Proceedings have been edited in **Researches in Cypriote History and Archaeology (Periplo 2)**.

**MUSINT. Interactive Museum of the Aegean and Cypriote antiquities in Tuscany.** This project, supported by the Tuscany Regional government, has been carried out with the contribution of several researchers of the University of Florence and other institutions, involving different expertises, from archaeology and history (as to the content), to informatics, architecture, engineering (as to the technical methodologies). The purpose has been the creation of a virtual museum conceived for a large audience, both specialized and curiosity driven. It may be accessed in the web page <http://aegean-museum.it> (or starting from DBAS). Inside the project also a volume has appeared in *Periplo* series (**Periplo 3**), with the contribution of both the participants to the actual MUSINT and further authors interested in an implementation of the project.

**MUSINT II. Cretan antiquities of Pigorini Museum in Rome and National Archaeological Museum in Florence.** This second project, which is the sequel of the first, concerns mainly the sealed written documents of the Neopalatial centre of Haghia Triada (Crete), in the two Italian Museums. A new volume (**Periplo 8**), starting from our researches and enlarged to other contributions about interactive museums has been published. The educational aspects, as an addition to scientific research, are particularly detailed.

**MUSINT, MUSINT II, and other analogous interactive/virtual museums** projects constitute one of the strategic Projects of SAGAS Department, concerning its Archaeological Section.

**E-Learning / Educational.** We are implementing this section of DBAS, which now begins to have a specific structure (it may be consulted also from the portal of aegean-museum.it). It consists of a series of lectures, conferences, seminars, about specific themes, with an educational aim. At the same time it offers some outlines on aspects of the Aegean civilisations which are not often object of discussion. Each one of the proposed lectures has previously been experimented as a *vis à vis* instrument, and only subsequently has been revised and written to be read.

**Periplo. Collana di Studi egei e ciprioti**, Firenze University Press. This series of books is comprehensive of Monographs, Conferences Proceedings, Reports of excavations and Miscellanea, partly dedicated to researches of young people and is also available on-line.

**Collaborations.** Collaborations and Conventions between our Laboratory and other Italian and foreign Universities and Cultural Institutes have been pursued and are presently active. Of particular interest a collaboration with the DREAMS Laboratory of the Scuola Normale Superiore of Pisa (DREAMS = Dedicated Research Environment for advanced Modeling and Simulations) allowed to widen the scientific and technological expertise of our projects and all the activities; we quote also the obvious collaboration with Italian and foreign Museums, with a natural peculiar link with the Archaeological Museum of Florence.

Prof. Jasink is also member of the Editorial Board of DO-SO-MO, Journal of Minoan-Mycenaean and Classical Studies of Piotrkow Trybunalski (Poland).

**“Researches in Cypriote History and Archaeology”**, Firenze 29-30 aprile 2009. Prof. Jasink and Dr. Luca Bombardieri have been the organizers of the Meeting and the Editors of the Proceedings which has appeared on *Periplo* series.

Actually, beside 6 **monographs**, Anna Margherita Jasink has written 91 **papers** and 11 **reviews**; has been **co-editing** of 7 books.
